A.H.S. displayed one of the top area football teams in 1989 as they finished with a record of 10 - 1 and captured the Suburban One Colonial Division crown. They were rated as high as #3 in the Southeastern Pa. polls. The GHOSTS opened the season with a 15 - 14 come from behind victory over a strong Bishop McDevitt team in their first ever meeting and concluded with 21 - 6 victory over Cheltenham. As many as five different players were placed on either all league teams or all area teams. Tinker Harris who will attend the University of Pittsburgh was chosen for the Pennsylvania Big 33 game against all stars from Maryland.

The boys basketball team finished second in the league with a 12 - 4 record and 15 - 9 overall, and are preparing for the District playoffs again and have advanced to the States.

The boys wrestling team seemed to lack numbers and were forced to forfeit many matches and finished with a 12 - 5 record. However, they did produce two of the area's best in Charles Fitzgerald at 140 pounds and Jon Mason at heavyweight. Charles (12 - 0 - 1) tied a school record for the most wins by a wrestler at A.H.S. with a record of 64 - 10 - 2 with one more year of competition remaining. Jon Mason was 16 - 2 - 2 and won his first round match in the District One tournament. Charles Fitzgerald won the district title and has advanced to the state tournament.

The girls swimming team was led by Dana Hazard and Katrina Sullivan, both of whom went to the P.I.A.A. State meet. The team finished with a 7 - 5 record.

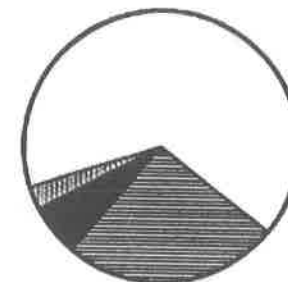
Odds & Ends

Alice F. Weaver, a retired teacher, died Oct. 12 at Homestead Nursing Home in Willow Grove. She was 96.

A longtime resident of Abington, Miss Weaver graduated from Susquehanna University in 1915 with a Bachelor of Arts degree in Latin, Greek, and science. She attended the Taylor School of Business, formerly of Philadelphia, and then returned to Susquehanna University, where she helped establish a business program while earning a Master of Arts degree in sociology and economics.

She taught at the Colwyn and Norwood Elementary Schools in Delaware County and at Sellersville High School before moving to Abington High School, where she taught for 35 years. She is survived by a sister, Charlotte W. Cassler, a brother, Luther M. Weaver Jr., and nieces and nephews.
