Jon Mason was 16-2-2 and won his first round match in the District One tournament. Charles Fitzgerald won the district title and has advanced to the state tournament.

The girls swimming team was led by Dana Hazard and Katrina Sullivan, both of whom went to the P.I.A.A. State meet. The team finished with a 7-5 record.


## Odds & Ends

Helen C. Clayton, 99, believed to be the oldest living graduate of Abington High School, died Nov. 20 at her home in Elkins Park.

She was the widow of Abraham Clayton.

Born in Jenkintown, Mrs. Clayton was active in her early years at St. Andrews Chapel, a mission of the Episcopal Church of Our Savior in the borough. She was married at the chapel and lived next door to the mission for many years. She graduated from Abington High School in 1907. She is survived by a son; Richard M.; two daughters, Nancy Plewes '37 and Julie Miller; three granddaughters, and four great—grandchildren.

#### ALICE F. WEAVER



Alice F. Weaver, a retired teacher, died Oct. 12 at Homestead Nursing Home in Willow Grove, She was 96.

A longtime resident of Abington, Miss Weaver graduated from Susquehanna University in 1915 with a Bachelor of Arts degree in Latin, Greek, and science. She attended the Taylor School of Business, formerly of Philadelphia, and then returned to Susquehanna University, where she helped establish a business program while earning a Master of Arts degree in sociology and economics.

She taught at the Colwyn and Norwood Elementary Schools in Delaware County and at Sellersville High School before moving to Abington High School, where she taught for 35 years. She also taught at the Columbia Institute in Philadelphia. In 1957, she joined the staff at Manor Junior College in Abington.

In 1969, Miss Weaver retired to the home on Guernsey Avenue that she shared with the late Juanita M. Downes, a longtime friend and fellow teacher.

Miss Weaver was active in Delta Kappa Gamma, a national professional teachers organization. She was a past matron of Penn Chapter 16 of the Order of the Eastern Star. In 1916, she helped organize Girl Scout Troop 1, the first troop in Delaware County.

She is survived by a sister, Charlotte W. Cassler, a brother, Luther M. Weaver Jr., and nieces and nephews.
