

Oscar Vance: 50 years of service to Abington

We often hear about people being pillars of the community, and Abington Township is lucky to have one in Oscar Vance '59. Oscar, a lifelong resident of the township, has given 50 years of outstanding service to his community.



After high school, he served in the Marine Corps from 1959 to 1963 and was a military policeman, a gunner (81mm mortars), and held the rank of sergeant E5. He is a member of the North Penn VFW Post 676 in Glenside.

After earning an associate degree in police sciences at Montgomery County Community College, Oscar earned an undergraduate degree in sociology and criminal justice from LaSalle University. His master of science in criminal justice and administration is from West Chester University. Oscar is also a graduate of the FBI National Academy and the Law Enforcement Hypnosis Institute in Los Angeles, Calif.

Serving in the Montgomery County District Attorney's Office since 1964, Oscar was appointed its chief in 1982. He supervised a staff of 52 employees, and was responsible for investigating and preparing criminal cases for prosecution,

and formulating policy concerning the operation of the DA's detective bureau.

He has held such prestigious positions as executive director of the International Hypnosis Association, president of the International Police Association (Region 13 in Pennsylvania), past president of the county and state Detective Associations, and also of the Citizens and Police Together. He rides in its Motorcycle Bike Day to raise funds for youth projects.

Oscar's extensive vitae includes 15 years as president and chairman of the scholarship committee of the Optimist Club of Lower Montco, which awards college scholarships to students from Ambler, Abington, Crestmont, McKinley, Norristown, and Penllyn; trustee of the Abington Hospital Foundation; member of the advisory board of the Pennsylvania Human Relations Commission; 33rd-degree Master Mason; and NAACP life member. His strong sense of giving back to the community led him to become a founding board member of the Abington Police Athletic League as well a member of the Abington Township Town Watch.

Oscar has received more than 50 service awards during his career, including Citizens For Progress Malcolm X Award, National Organization of Black Law Enforcement Executives Distinguished Service Award, International Police Associa-

He is still a committeeman in Abington's Ward 5-2, where he resides.

Donna Bates Cockenbergh '67 spends summers as a program director of the Kids Theatre Workshop in Skip-pack, and the rest of the year teaching art at Willow Dale Elementary School in Warminster. tion Hall of Fame Award, Montgomery County Community College Hall of Fame Award, Abington High School Hall of Fame Award, and Salem Baptist Church Man of the Year Award and Family of the Year Award.

He is certified by the Supreme Court of Pennsylvania, Minor Judiciary Education Board for District Justice. The courts recognize Chief Vance as an expert law enforcement forensic hypnosis investigator assisting law enforcement agencies in solving difficult crimes including murders, rapes, burglaries, and robberies. He is also an expert in the detection and identification of narcotics, sellers, and users. Oscar has received recognition for working undercover narcotics investigations and numerous homicide and fraud investigations.

In 2012, Oscar retired from his chief of detectives position to start a new venture, Vance Investigations and Corporate Solutions, where he hopes to match programs and resources that will change lives in the community, and replace low expectations with excellence.

He stated that his vision for the Abington area "is a safe place to live where we promote the development of our children." Community goals include good schools, youth mentorship, and supporting community organizations that help young people.

Oscar's three children, Nicole, Oscar, and Lloyd, are all graduates of Abington High School, and Oscar is a proud grandfather of seven. The Alumni Association salutes this community hero and wishes him the best of luck in his endeavors.

Alum crosses country walking for the birds

Brad Storey '63 recently completed a walk across the United States, accompanied by his 3-year-old Siberian Husky, Xena. They started in September 2011 at Brunswick Island on the Georgia coast and spent seven months walking a southern route, arriving at the Pacific Ocean in San Diego on April 6, 2012.

Backpacking and averaging 15 to 20 miles a day, they spent 165 nights on the road, 135 of those camping along the highway in a small backpacking tent. They reached Brad's niece's house in San Antonio on New Year's Day and rested for 2 weeks. During that time Brad got a small cart to carry food and water for the much longer distances between towns on the Western half of the walk.

An avid bird watcher, Brad made the walk partly as a fundraiser for the Na-



tional Audubon Society. He and Xena visited Audubon centers along the route,

including those at Gulfport, Baton Rouge, Houston, San Antonio, and Tucson. The hardest part of the trip, he says, was dealing with the heat and desert conditions in Arizona and California, although the cold, the rain, and the windy weather in Texas and New Mexico were difficult also.

Two of Brad's grown children helped immensely by keeping a blog (<http://birdmanwalking.wordpress.com>) and Facebook page up-to-date and by arranging several homes for him to visit along the way. Brad has just completed a book about the walk, titled, *A Prisoner of My Own Dream*, which describes the walk and what it

meant to him, especially meeting so many wonderful people.

Sports

The boys and girls basketball teams and the boys soccer team highlighted Abington's athletic year. In the fall, Abington's soccer team, which was seeded 17th in District 1, won the district championship by beating Central Bucks East. The final game pitted two Abington grads against one another: Coach Randy Garber '71 vs. Coach Mike Gorni '76 of C.B. East. Abington then lost in the PIAA first round of the state tournament to finish the season at 15-8-1. Christopher Tracy was selected as the Southeastern Pennsylvania Player of the Year.

The boys basketball team won the Suburban 1 National Conference. They were led by Anthony Durham and Jordan Simmons, who both made first team all-conference. The team finished third in District 1, losing to powerful Chester, the state 4A runner-up. Entering the state tournament, they lost to St. Joseph's Prep to close the season with a noteworthy record of 22-6.

The girls basketball team also made the state playoffs, but lost in the first round. They finished with a 16-8 record, and were led by all-conference selectee Deja Rawls.

Abington's football team qualified for the district playoffs, but lost 35-14 in the first round to a strong Pennridge team. Abington finished the season with a 7-0 victory over its rival, Cheltenham on Thanksgiving morning. The team ended with an 8-4 record.

The girls volleyball team also made the districts, but lost in the first round to Council Rock North and finished with a 9-9 record. Senior Liz Gassman was named *All-Intelligencer* Player of the Year by the *Intelligencer* newspaper in Bucks County. Liz was a four-year starter, team captain, and made first team All-Suburban National Conference. Liz played on Synergy 17 Orange Team which won the 2012 Junior Nationals. She will attend Marist College in New York on a volleyball scholarship. Regi-

na Seweryn also earned a scholarship to Hartford University for volleyball.

Congratulation to these players, coaches, and teams.
