Jim Staerk, '77 was an Alumni Scholarship recipient when he graduated from Abington. This year he graduated from La Salle College with honors and plans to go to law school. He has been an active member and officer of Tau Kappa Epsilon Fraternity during his four years at La Salle.

Sounds like your everyday college student, and essentially Jim is . . . but with one exception. He attended his classes in a wheel chair because he has suffered from muscular dystrophy since birth. There have been problems for Staerk but none have kept him from compiling a 3.3 grade point average as a public administration major.

With ramps adjacent to nearly every building on the campus, he has been able to enter the facilities without a problem and could go into the library to do his own research. Outside the classroom, his transportation problems were taken care of by his family and friends.

Staerk lives in Roslyn and comes from a family of seven children. One of his four sisters, Theresa, who is graduating from Temple University, understands the problem he encounters, because she is also confined to a wheel chair. He is confident that he will be accepted to law school. Then, he says, he will just be another law student, going through life like anyone else.

Now I work in the field of education and, even though I am 100 miles away, many other educators know Abington and recognize it for the high expectations set. I have found while working in the schools that many of the advantages we shared at Abington ten years ago are still not available in other schools today. Now I realize how lucky I was to attend Abington schools.

Mariene graduated from Lebanon Valley College, Annville, Pa. in 1975. Magna Cum Laude with B.A. in Psychology and minor in Education.

She received an M.S. in Clinical Psychology from Millersville in 1977. Masters thesis was on moral development in adolescence. She received a school psychology certificate in 1978 and worked in New Oxford, Pa. as a school psychologist for a year and a half.

The last two years she has worked as a school psychologist in Glen Rock, Pa. serving 3000 students. Beyond psychological duties, she is also working with the Lincoln Intermediate Unit Special Education Advisory Council, helping coordinate all district special education programs including EMR, LD, and Gifted, and writing the district Special Education Plan for the State Department of Education.

Alumni Sponsored Music Theater

In 1949, a handful of AHS graduates who had studied music under T. Carroll O'Brien, conceived the idea of the Music Theater of Abington, and asked the Alumni Association to sponsor the undertaking. We demonstrated our support by lending a sizable amount of money to this enthusiastic nucleus of twenty closely-knit devotees who had as their mentor and guiding light, O'Bie's widow Thelma.

After two years of doing Gilbert and Sullivan operettas, they moved on to light opera . . . Victor Herbert and Sigmund Romberg. At about this time the company decided to seek outside support and enlisted backing from twenty-five "Angels" who consisted mostly of their parents. In 1956 they moved up to the big time of modern Broadway musicals.

Their productions became so popular that they soon were able to repay the loan from the Alumni Association and in 1953 a scholarship fund was established with a percentage of the group's profits. The fund was named as a memorial to Mr. O'Brien and to this date a total of \$42,000 has been awarded to seventy-four graduates to further their study of music, as well as several cash awards to other deserving students.

The move into the newly-built high school (south campus) in 1957 was a gigantic step upward as the huge stage offered so much more in production facilities. The Music Theater of Abington was the first organization to take advantage of this marvelous setting . . . probably the best in the area.

In appreciation they purchased the original electronic organ for the auditorium at a cost of \$4,200, and years later when it was beyond repair, they donated a large amount toward the purchase of the new one. Early rehearsals for shows are held in the gymnasium of Abington Jr. prior to production in the big school, and the group also donated a piano to that facility.

In thirty-two years, almost 4000 participants of the Music Theater, have brought untold pleasure to audiences. A number of similar groups have started up in the area, but our Alumni Association can be proud of being instrumental in the founding of the biggest and best.

the appointment of the farsighted, courageous and prescient Dr. O.H. English as Superintendent. The decision was made to build a new, revolutionary, one floor facility costing more than \$23,000,000 on 57 acres in the center of the township. The classrooms would accommodate 1500 students with a professional level theatre auditorium, library, gymnasium and swimming pool for community residents. The South Campus, two year plant opened for classes in the fall of 1956. During the 50s, the Abington School District became a leader in education in Pennsylvania and the nation, receiving wide acclaim for excellence in academic, vocational and business education.

Dr. Matthew W. Gaffney was Superintendent in 1962 when the decision was made to house ninth and tenth grade students separately from eleventh and twelfth, and to reorganize the district from the 6-3-3 plan to a 6-2-2-2 pattern. The North Campus High School building was erected at a cost of about \$6,000,000. It opened in September 1964 and in addition to 62 traditional classrooms and 21 seminar rooms, the building contained special features such as a little theater and large group instruction facilities.

On July 1, 1966 Dr. Thomas R. Bowman assumed Superintendent's duties as the Rockledge Elementary School joined the 11 other Elementary Schools, three Junior High Schools and the North and South High School Campus to form the new Abington School District.

Although some administration officials foresee a levelling off of enrollment before 1985, student enrollment continues to decline entering the 1980's with totals expected to drop under 7000 in 1982. Six schools have been closed and/or sold in the last three years. The Huntington Junior High School may be closed in 1982 or 1983 and three grades installed at both North and South Campus High Schools.

The Abington School District will withdraw from the Montgomery County Vocational Technical School Program in June of 1983, after an exhaustive year's study showed that the district can maintain a better program for less money within the district with district personnel.

The Abington School District still maintains high national ratings academically... which shows at least, that quality has survived quantity.

Six veterans' groups honored Montgomery County Commissioner, A. Russell Parkhouse, '34, with the American Patriot Award for an act of "loyalty, courage and patriotism in these times of cynicism."

Parkhouse confronted a group of activists who were carrying the American flag upside down and displaying placards with the slogan "Disarm and Live", on the steps of the Montgomery County Court House in Norristown. In an angry exchange of words, Parkhouse said, "You can't do that to my flag!" After a brief scuffle, he took the flag, folded it military fashion and handed it back to the demonstrators.

U.S. Rep. R. Lawrence Coughlin (R., Pa.) was also at the presentation meeting in March and compared A. Russell Parkhouse to the fife-and-drum corp of old and to the Marines raising the flag on Iwo Jima. He said the incident served to "remind us of the feeling that all of us have at times. . . that enough is enough."

Oldest Retired Teacher A.H.S. Alumnae 1909



Miss Irene Allen graduated from Abington High School, one of four, in the class of 1909.

The above statement could have been just a final record of a young girl's education. It was, however, a stepping stone in the life of one of Abington township's devoted teachers.

Miss Allen, a farm girl born April 13, 1892, received her elementary schooling in a small, two room school house in Horsham. At Abington she studied in the building which is now the office of the superintendent of schools.

After completing further education Miss Allen passed the Bucks and Montgomery counties teacher examination, and in 1918 was hired by the Hill Creek School in Warrington where she taught grades 1 to 8. This was a complete teaching experience. She walked four miles to school each day, and was responsible for cleaning the area, taking care of the fire, any other associated duties, and teaching. All this for forty-five dollars a month.

From Hill Creek School Miss Allen moved to Springfield, by way once more of Horsham Township. During her stay in Springfield she met and married Marcus Creamer. Then, in the early 1920's, Mr. Edward S. Ling, Abington School Superintendent, invited Mrs. Creamer back to Abington to teach. She was back home, and this is where she wanted to be. She taught for thirty-two years in the Abington School District, including classes in Park School, Abington Junior, and Highland Elementary School.

Mrs. Creamer retired in 1954 from the staff at Highland School, and as she said, "I wouldn't hesitate to do it all over again."

A.H.S. CAMPUS MARKS 25 YEAR INVESTMENT IN YOUTH

A story of growth...
A story of rise and dreams abuilding...
A story of reluctant regression.

From six "common" schools, 300 students, six teachers each paid less than \$30 a year from total tax revenue of less than \$2000 and state grant of \$179.20 a year in 1855; the Abington Township School District festooned into a 19 building complex with 12,482 students, 700 teachers and an assessed evaluation of \$150,000,000 in 1970.

The first graduating class from Abington High School in 1888 consisted of just two girls. From that time until

1920, construction of Abington School District buildings raced along paralleling the nation's population growth.

The North Hills Elementary School (now closed) was erected in 1896 and the McKinley Elementary School was built the following year.

But the most significant construction at the beginning of this century was the Abington Senior High School at Susquehanna and Huntingdon Roads, which was completed in 1908. Five additions and renovations followed in 1918, 1923, 1926, 1939 and 1940.

This facility, which became Huntingdon Jr. High when the new high school opened in 1956, housed more than a thousand seventh and eighth grade pupils in the 1970's but accommodated less than 700 this year.

The first Abington Superintendent of Schools, **Edward S. Ling**, was elected in 1913. During his 21 year tenure, six new school buildings were completed. Ling was succeeded by **Joseph C. Weirick** in 1934. School building ceased during the Second World War, but resumed with a swaggering surge as a result of the "Baby Boom" at the end of the war and

ELLIE DANIEL - '68 GRAD OLYMPIC GOLD MEDAL WINNER

Ellie Daniel, '68, was a member of three U.S.A. OLYMPIC TEAMS. In 1968 in Mexico City she won a gold medal swimming butterfly in the 400 meter medley relay (in world record time); a silver in the 100 meter Individual butterfly and a bronze medal in the 200 meter individual "fly". She was captain of the WOMEN'S OLYMPIC SWIM TEAM in the 1972 OLYMPICS in Munich and came home with a bronze medal in the 200 meter individual butterfly.

In the 1976 OLYMPICS Ellie was chosen as Athlete Liaison Representative to serve as official representative of Olympic Athletes (all sports), and as liaison between athletes and administrators on Olympic Team.
