

Ghost" originated at Abington High School? It started about 1926 when Glen Snodgrass was a very sucessful football coach at A.H.S. Prior to his arrival, the High School had no mascot or descriptive slogan as it's rallying focus. Coach Snodgrass wanted his teams to be recognized as Abington "(something)." He had attended the University of Illinois where Red Grange was his teammate. Red Grange was one of the greatest football players of all times - all American halfback 1923 and 1924 and all-American quarterback in 1925. He was known as the Galloping Ghost because it was almost impossible to

The Hall of Fame Committee and The Alumni Association have agreed to recognize a prominent deceased Abington graduate. This award will be given every other year to a member who will be selected by the Alumni Assoc. This first year the Association has appropriately chosen Russell Parkhouse.

Mr. Parkhouse, who died Jan. 2, 1986 was chairman of the Board of Montgomery County Commissioners for 19 years. He moved to Abington Township as a boy and was an active soccer, basketball and track team member and involved in student politics. He worked as an accountant after graduating from the Wharton School of the University of Pennsylvania. In 1942 he was appointed Abington Township Treasurer. After his election as county commissioner Eastern Montgomery County became the seat of county power. He oversaw the expansion of the county courthouse with the geriatric center and enthusiastically supported construction of Montgomery County Community College and development of the public parklands.

During the 1981 Plowshares Eight Trial he scuffled on the courthouse steps with a group of peace activists who had pasted the message "Disarm and Live" on an upside-down American flag. "You can't do that to my flag," he declared before seizing the flag, folding it correctly and returning it to the demonstrators. He was awarded the American Patriot Award for his actions.
