WHAT'S NEW AT ABINGTON HIGH SCHOOL

In October of 1989 the Faculty of AHS won a \$55,000 grant from the State for raising the SAT scores of our students more than any other school in the state. This, at a time when scores nationally are dropping. The faculty is to be commended for their usual fine work. The money was to be used for a project of their choice. They chose to set up a MacIntosh computer room for the use of students at any time, with no scheduled classes to bar individual students from using the room. The "Mac" room now joins the IBM room and the Apple room. The latter are used for classes and are heavily scheduled. The room opened in late fall of 1990.

The Honor Society induction was held in November. The speaker was Dr. Barry Stupine, Associate Dean of the School of Veterinary Medicine at the University of Pennsylvania.

The all school musical, "The King & I" was held on March 1 & 2 and was extremely successful. The cast, crew, and faculty advisors all did a fine job, as usual.

Donald W. Scheuer, Chairman of the Math Department at Abington Junior High, won the Presidential Award for Excellence in Teaching Mathematics. The award included a \$7500 grant for the Math Dept. Only 4 teachers per state were so honored. Congratulations to Don.

The AHS Science Bowl Team placed first in the Northeastern United States and fourth in the nation at the April, 1990 event held in San Diego. Chairman and Coach Fred Fisher led an able team of Peter Bell, Tony Goldstein, Alison Barrett and Robert Weggel. Congratulations to these future Einsteins.

At the 1990 Graduation exercises, Principal Norman Schmid gave out a record high \$750,000 in scholarships and awards.

The Model Legislature Team was coached by Don Casto of the Social Studies Department. In May of 1990, Doug Simon, Doug Risen, Jason Schwartz, Carl Lin, Jennifer Green and Michael Stock represented AHS. Jason was the Youth Governor and Michael won the award for the best written bill.

AHS had 4 Merit Scholar National Semi-finalists. They are Michael Goodman, Bum Choi, Christina Kowalchuk, and Shannon March. Shannon was also a semi-finalist in the National Achievement Scholarship Program for Outstanding Negro Students. AHS also had nine Commended Merit Scholars. Commended students are in the top 5% nationally and their names are sent to colleges for recognition and scholarships. Another alumni congratulations to these fine students.

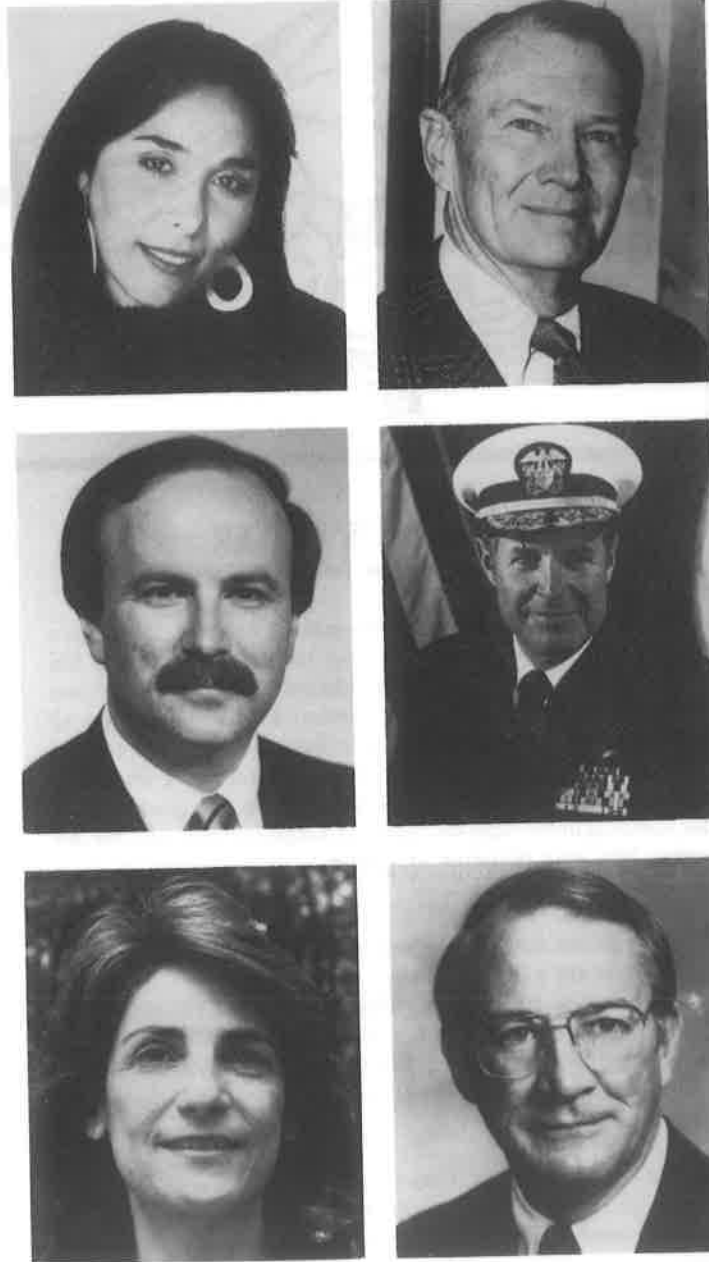
- By category, the award recipients were the following:

HOWARD B. SHAFFER - 1916-1990

Howard Shaffer of Abington died October 22, 1990, at Troy Community Hospital in Troy, Pennsylvania. He was formerly the President and Chairman of the board of S.S. Fretz, Inc., of Philadelphia. "Howdy," as he was known to his friends and associates, graduated from Abington High School in 1933. In 1960, when the Alumni Association was considering discontinuance, he, along with other volunteers, opted to work for its continuance. He was elected treasurer and became the driving force in rebuilding the Alumni Association into the fine organization it is today. Up to the point that he stepped down as treasurer, the group had raised \$101,000, an amount held in perpetuity for scholarship awards. This amount represented 26 years of "Howdy's" volunteerism to the A.H.S.A.A. Until the time of his death, he had seen the organization he rescued grant over \$105,000 in scholarship awards. Quite a tribute to this particularly proud graduate from Abington!

For over twenty years, the 2nd floor of the Shaffer home in Abington served as headquarters for the Alumni Association. He and his wife Ethel, who died in 1982, gave unstintingly of their time and resources to the Association. "Howdy" spurred his staff of volunteers to track down Abington graduates. They eventually produced class records that are second to none in the field of high school alumni associations. This is a fact. Not to be taken lightly! In 1986 "Howdy's" health problems made it necessary for the alumni to seek help from the school authorities for housing. Space was made available, and we are now established in the Administration Building.

Many awards and honors came to "Howdy" over the years, but the one he cherished was the 1988 Hall of Fame Award from Abington High School.

All of us miss "Howdy's" expertise in office management, his invaluable memory for Abingtonian facts; but most of all, we are proud of the legacy he gave to Abington graduates when he successfully resurrected the Alumni Association.
