# Two former presidents retire from Alumni Association

Two titans of the Alumni Association have retired, leaving behind a legacy of accomplishment and treasured memories. As of January, both Charles M. "Chuck" Corwin, Jr. '40, and A. Thomas Came-

ron, Jr. '36, called it a career after a combined 60- plus years of devoted service.

Chuck joined the Association in 1979, serving as vice president until 1981, when he became president. Beginning in 1986, he served as computer and data processing manager, coordinating the database of information on all of Abington's 37,000 graduates. Since 1995, he has managed and coordinated the annual luncheon for the Fifty Plus Club. This event, for

graduates beyond 50 years, draws an attendance in excess of 400 and provides a substantial donation each year to the Association's scholarship fund.

Born in West Philadelphia, Chuck moved to Glenside with his parents in 1924. He attended Glenside-Weldon Elementary and Junior High Schools, graduating from Abington Senior High School in January 1940. In his last two years at Abington, he played drums in the marching and concert bands.

Tom, who also served a term as alumni president, joined the Association in 1960. During his many years of service his titles included Scholarship Chairman and most recently Membership Chairman. As Tom departs, the number of life memberships in the Association has now passed the 11,000 mark, a true tribute to his dedication. In addition, it was Tom, along with Chuck, who supervised the news staff for this newsletter and recruited the volunteers to sort, label and make Ghost Stories a
