He qualified for the state championships, winning one match, and ending the season with a 34-3 record.

Former AHS principal Allan Glatthorn dies at 83

Former Abington High School principal and internationally known educator and scholar Dr. Allan Glatthorn died Sept. 5, 2007, after an extended illness. He was 83 and lived in Washington, N.C.

Former students at Abington remember Dr. Glatthorn as a man "ahead of his time." His public school career spanned 24 years, all of which were spent at Abington, where he was an English teacher and supervisor before becoming principal. While Dr. Glatthorn was principal from 1963 to 1971, Abington won national recognition for innovative programs and academic excellence.

Following his career at Abington, Dr. Glatthorn joined the faculty of the University of Pennsylvania's Graduate School of Education in 1972. He became director of teacher education and later chairman of the educational leadership department. He held postdoctoral fellowships at Harvard University and the University of Chicago, and was a Fulbright scholar in Portugal. He was named professor emeritus at the University of Pennsylvania after his retirement in 1987. Dr. Glatthorn moved to North Carolina and retired in 2003 as

a professor emeritus of East Carolina University.

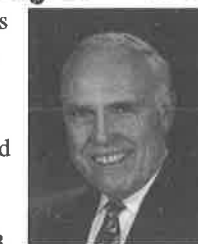
Dr. Glatthorn's sphere of influence reached far beyond the halls of the institutions which he served. He was the author of 36 books in the fields of school leadership, curriculum, and supervision, as well as 40 textbooks in English language arts. Several of his books were translated into foreign languages. A firm believer in the transformative power of

education, he was a noted speaker and national authority on secondary education; serving on numerous councils including the National Council for the Humanities by appointment of President Lyndon Johnson.

All in all, he dedicated 59 years of his life to education. Indeed, he enriched the lives of so many Abington graduates, unaware in their formative years that they were being touched by greatness.

Remembering J. Clayton Worster '32, public servant

As we were just about to go to press with this latest edition of *Ghost Stories*, news reached the alumni office of the March 30 passing of J. Clayton Worster '32, a man who will be long remembered for his lifetime of dedicated service to Abington schools. Clay, as he was known to most, was featured in the 2003 edition of this newsletter upon his retirement from AHSAA.



From the President

Following his 1932 graduation from Abington High School, where he was a student athlete, Clay enrolled at Ursinus College, from which he graduated in 1937 with a finance degree. Although he gave distinguished service with the U.S. Army and corporate America, his legacy will be his formidable career in public service.

Clay served for 50 years as a member of the Abington

School District Authority, and was instrumental in funding construction of the current senior high school as well as several elementary schools. His service with AHSAA spanned more than 30 years and included a long tenure as chairman of the Scholarship Committee. He lived in Abington and was 93 at his death; his wife, Caroline, died in 2007. He's survived by two sons and four grandchildren. We will greatly miss this loyal Abingtonian with his engaging sense of humor and generosity of spirit.

In high school news, Dr. Robert Burt will retire as principal of AHS at the end of this school year. Our new principal will be Dr. Jeffrey Fecher, now at Willow Hill Elementary. Your Alumni Association wishes to thank Dr. Burt for his dedicated efforts to make our high school one of excellence.
