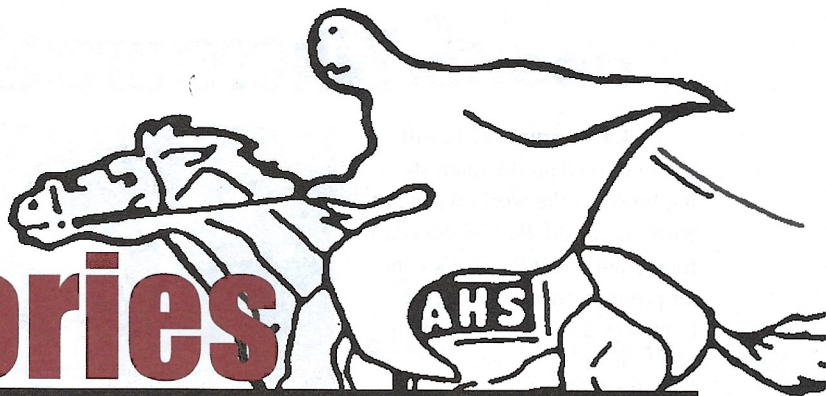

## Association mourns loss of longtime president

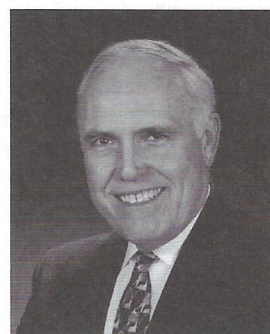
Bill Landherr '55, president of the Abington High School Alumni Association from 1998 to 2010, passed away June 10, 2010, at age 72.

A resident of Horsham, Pa., Bill was a 1959 graduate of Penn State University with a degree in industrial engineering. He also was alumni president of Penn State's Delta Upsilon fraternity for 31 years.

He served in the Navy aboard the U.S.S. Franklin D. Roosevelt, which patrolled the Mediterranean Sea. He remained in the Naval Reserve for over 30 years, retiring as a captain in the mid-1990s. He was a member of the VR-52 Fleet Logistics Support Squadron at Willow Grove Naval Air Base.

Bill started his own business, Corro Therm, Inc., in 1971 and served as its president until his death. The company, based in Feasterville, Pa., provided specialized protective coatings for the aerospace, biomedical, automotive, and electronics industries, among others, as well as the military and sports facilities.

He was a lay pastor and church choir member of the Chestnut Hill Seventh-Day Adventist Church. Bill was a member of the Trevoise Horticultural Society and won awards for his dahlia displays. One of his strong interests was baseball card collecting and the Phillies.



Bill was passionate about his Abington Class of 1955, and was diligent about keeping the class list current. A yearly picnic and his frequent emails kept his classmates in touch.

He is survived by his wife, Mary Schwartzel, his five children, 10 grandchildren, and a sister, Margaret "Peggy" Bartley '59.

# Sports

Abington High's football team had a great season in 2010, ending with a 10-3 record. The only losses were to Central Bucks East and Neshaminy (who beat the Ghosts twice). Neshaminy's second victory over Abington came in the district playoffs, in the second round after Abington had won its first-round game 47-7 against Cheltenham. On a snowy Thanksgiving morning, Abington won a hard-fought battle against Cheltenham 16-7.

The other fall sport that did well was

soccer. Randy Garber's team finished with a winning record after making the district playoffs, but lost in the first round.

Abington graduate Mike Gorni led his soccer team, Central Bucks East, to the state finals where they lost a tough overtime game 2-1.

The girls basketball team again made the district playoffs with a 14-9 record, but bowed out in the first round, losing to Council Rock North, the eventual District 1 runner up.

Abington, had a sensational indoor track season, winning both the boys and girls state championships. The boys edged Cheltenham 40 to 38 for the title. They were led by the winning 4 x 400 relay team of Macey Watson, Josh Swift, Tevin Smith, and Will Taylor. Their time was the best in the nation. The boys team is coached by Bill Neeley.

The girls overpowered their rivals, scoring 47 points to Strath Haven's running total of 28. Jordan Matthews won the long jump with a leap of 18 feet, 10.5 inches. Abington won the 4 x 200 relay with Leah Nugent, Nicole Grasty, Jordan Matthews, and Rachel Strother, and the 4 x 4 relay with the same runners. Leah Nugent also won the 60-meter hurdles in 8.45 seconds.

Nugent, the reigning PIAA and Penn Relays 500 meter hurdles champion, accepted a scholarship to Virginia Tech for the fall of 2011. She beat Jamaica's star Ristananna Tracey in the 400-meter hurdles at the 2010 Penn Relays, while also tying the state record in the 300-meter hurdles. Her Abington sprint coach Karl Gaines expects her to be ready for the 2016 Olympics.

## Highland's Chou is Pa. Teacher of Year

For the past 14 years, Jeffrey Chou has taught fifth and sixth grades at Highland Elementary School. He mentors new teachers, has served on the board of the Children's International Summer Village (which organizes summer exchange programs), makes up a DVD slideshow from former students' time in his class, and sends his former students letters when they enter high school and when they graduate. Jeffrey maintains a class website with a blog that has links to articles he wants his students to read. For all of this and more, he was named Pennsylvania Teacher of the Year for 2010.

He'll represent Pennsylvania in the 2011 National Teacher of the Year competition.

# Three retired teachers are busier than ever

The Philadelphia Phillies may have their four aces, but Abington High School has its own "Three Aces." Ray Coleman, Bill Grun, and Norm Kelly are three retired Abington teachers dedicated to *not* retiring, but being active in community service. Since leaving Abington, each has followed an interesting path.

◆ **Ray Coleman** graduated from Hatboro High School, where he earned letters in four sports, and was subsequently elected into the Hatboro-Horsham Hall of Fame. He went on to earn a bachelor's of science from East Stroudsburg University, and a master's in education from Temple University. He also has 60 credits beyond his master's. Ray served in the Air Force during World War II. In 1950, he started teaching at Abington Junior High School, moving to the senior high school in 1952.

While at the senior high, Ray taught physical education, served as chairman of the health and physical education department, was athletic director, organized the driver education program, and coached basketball, swimming, and golf. He also found time to coach soccer at Penn State (Abington Campus), and organize the athletic program at Shelton College in New Jersey. In addition Ray officiated football, soccer, basketball and baseball. Ray retired from Abington in 1986.

Ray is the executive secretary for the Suburban One League, and has been involved with the Scholar/Athlete Scholarship, League anniversary functions, and Suburban One history booklet. He received the League's first Lifetime Achievement Award. The Ray Coleman Soccer Scholarship is awarded yearly by the Philadelphia Suburban Soccer Association. His 62 years in the Suburban League entitles Ray to be known as "Mr. Suburban One League." Ray, who



lives in Doylestown, faithfully attends the Association's Fifty Plus Luncheon every October.

◆ **Bill Grun** came to Abington in 1949 as a high school industrial arts teacher. When he became department chairman, he built the program from 45 students to a high of 1,500 students with eight teachers. He attended Penn State starting in 1938, but left to work for Gulf Oil in 1940, followed by a stint in the Navy from 1941 to 1945. He returned to Penn State finish his undergraduate degree as well as his master's. Bill also did graduate and undergraduate work at Temple University and the University of Pennsylvania. He taught for two years in Bristol Township before coming to Abington. While at Abington, he was the assistant high school soccer coach, and later coached the ninth-grade team for 12 years.



Bill considers himself a "classroom man," and has helped 16 former students become industrial arts teachers. He retired from Abington in 1980, but still manages to keep his hand in teaching at Holicong Middle School in the Central Bucks School District. His work now consists of house painting, carpentry, and building homes for a Native American reservation in the Southwest. He's involved with Habitat for Humanity and a local Doylestown group helping to build homes in Louisiana and Mississippi.

For recreation, Bill still does long-distance biking, touring throughout the United States. In 2008, he took a seven-day Rails-to-Trails bicycle trip from Washington, D.C., to Pittsburgh, Pa. He also keeps busy with church-related activities. At age 90, he doesn't let any grass grow under his feet, and often attends the Fifty Plus luncheons.

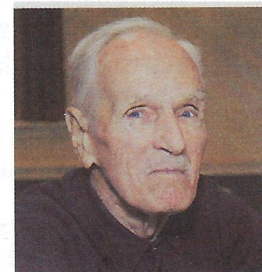
Bill, who lives in Gwynedd Estates in Ambler, is especially proud that one

of his daughters, Margaret Grun Kibben, is an admiral in the Navy's Chaplain Corps.

◆ **Norman (Norm) Kelly** graduated from Abington in 1938 and he was vice president of his senior class and president of the student council. He earned varsity letters in wrestling, track, and also cross-country, which was in its first year at Abington. Norm received his bachelor's of science from West Chester State Teachers College, where he lettered in track, soccer, cross-country, and wrestling, which was a new sport at the college. He has master's degrees from the University of Pennsylvania and Temple University. He served with the Navy in the Pacific during World War II, and also taught chemical warfare for the Justice Department.

Norm taught social studies for 37 years (1946 to 1983) at Abington Junior High School, where he started the wrestling program. For his activities as a classroom teacher, he was awarded the Freedom Foundation Medal at Valley Forge. Norm, who lives in Ivyland, has served his community well as its

mayor and on the parks and recreation committee and town council. He was a charter member of the Federal Lands Recreation Au-



thority of Bucks County, and received praise from the county for his years of voluntary service.

Norm has served as a vice president of the Alumni Association and is a longtime member of the Association's Scholarship Committee. He's under consideration for the Abington High School Hall of Fame in the Education category.

The Association thanks our "Three Aces" for choosing to teach at Abington, and for their spirit and devotion to help promote "excellence as (the) standard and achievement as the result."
