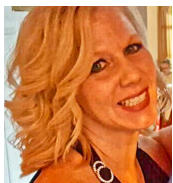

Where are they now?

Stephen Schwarzman, class of 1965 is to receive an honorary British knighthood for services to philanthropy. Knighthoods are reserved for those who make a “pre-eminent contribution in any field of activity”.

Mike Shuster '65, an award-winning foreign and diplomatic correspondent for National Public Radio passed away in November of 2023. During more than three decades as a reporter and an editor, his work spanned the world and made him an eyewitness to some of the most momentous events in modern history. His long career, began in the early 1970s in Africa, where he spent five months covering the Angolan civil war and traveled throughout the region, working then for Liberation News Service. He joined NPR in 1980 and filed more than 3,000 stories, with coverage spanning both Gulf wars, conflicts in Israel and Palestine, the Bosnian civil war and the war in Kosovo, and the collapse of the Soviet Union. As a senior diplomatic correspondent, he covered issues of nuclear nonproliferation and weapons of mass destruction, terrorism, and the Pacific Rim. He notably traveled frequently to Iran — at least seven times after 2004 — where he was one of the few American correspondents to spend extended time. RIP.

Carl Fertman '67 was honored as associate professor emeritus from a 40 year career at the University of Pittsburgh School of Education. He wrote ten books on topics including youth leadership development, service learning, school-based mental health programs and health promotion programs from theory to action. He and wife Barb have six children and many grandchildren. In retirement, he works with and supports refugee families in Pittsburgh through his synagogue.

Adam Shapiro '98 has been cutting his teeth on television and the silver screen for years. He most recently appeared in the critically acclaimed series “The Bear” and has appeared in “Never Have I Ever,” “Steve Jobs,” and “Mank,” among other productions. Now, he and his wife Katie Lowes are the hosts of the new season of “Chasing Sleep.” On “Chasing Sleep,” Shapiro and Lowes “explore how sleep affects love, aging, parenting, and even the creative process.” Other topics include why we dream, how technology is affecting sleep, and whether supplements are a good idea. Episodes center around roundtable conversations with experts and guests exploring the magic and science of sleep and how it touches every element of our lives and relationships.

Ryan Williams'96 took his first job as a kitchen tray line worker at Abington Memorial Hospital. He attended Drexel University and graduated with a BS from Drexel's School of Perfusion in 2005. He is currently working as a Cardiovascular Perfusionist at the Lehigh Valley Hospital. He is finishing his graduate work on an MBA at DeSales University. Ryan has been married for 20 years, has three children, a daughter at Temple University, another daughter, a senior at North Penn High School and a son at Pennedale Middle School. The Williams live in Lansdale, and Ryan's sister LaCountess Williams-Ingram graduated from Abington in 1989.

Danielle Ruttenberg '01 is a trained glassblower, entrepreneur. She founded and operated DR Glass Design, a custom glass art and fabrication business from 2007 to 2015. Then, in early 2016, shortly after the

birth of her first child, Danielle co-founded Remark Glass, a fully-sustainable, zero-waste custom glass studio located in the revitalized Bok Building in South Philadelphia. Combining art and sustainability, Remark Glass fulfills its mission of creating sustainable art and manufacturing practices by employing traditional glassblowing techniques to repurpose discarded bottle glass into small batch home accessories. Next, in 2020, Danielle and her team went on to form Bottle Underground, committed to increasing their impact in waste reduction and generating jobs for the local community. Remark Glass is the first official Gold-Level Zero Waste Partner designee by the City of Philadelphia. Danielle and the Remark team have also been recognized as a 2019 SustainPHL Business Impact Leader, 2022 Coralus US Venture, and 2023 REDF Accelerator Program graduate. Danielle@remarkglass.com.

Cpl. Benjamin Berry '43 a US Army veteran of World War II received the Order of Merits of the Grand Duchy of Luxembourg in 2021. The following year he was inducted into the Quartermaster Hall of Fame. In 2023 he was an honorary co-grand Marshal of the Philadelphia veteran's parade. On March 18 the 100-year-old will be awarded the highest honor from the French government- Legion of Honor. The Ceremonie Legion d'honneur was Ilene Oller first created by Napoleon Bonaparte in 1802. His work helped France prevail over the Nazis. Legion d'honneur will recognize Berry's servicing commitment to the veteran community and his service in France during World War II. The US Department of Veterans Affairs estimates less than 120,000 World War II veterans are still alive with 131 dying daily He was drafted in 1943 after graduation.

Stacy Gallant Avery, 87, resides in Upper Dublin township with her husband, Todd Avery of 29 years, and their two black labradors. Together, they raised two incredible daughters, Sydni and Taylor. After graduating from Towson State University in 1991, Stacy had a career as an Advertising Account Executive for many years. In 2020, Stacy embarked on a journey that would take her in a direction she could have never imagined. After being a “yo-yo” dieter most of her life and never feeling comfortable or confident in her skin, Stacy was introduced to a program that changed her life, physically and mentally. Upon her success with her health battle, she decided she wanted to share her passion and joy of helping others and became a Certified Health Coach with Optavia. Since becoming a health coach, Stacy has helped over 2,000 clients with their healthy habits. She has quite a following on Facebook and other social media platforms, where she does live cooking videos, shares her clients' journeys, and provides helpful information to motivate and inspire others.”

Patricia Hermann Conroy '64 wrote a delightful children's book titled “Mockingbird Moon”. In this enchanting tale, a child's imagination is sparked by an unexpected middle-of-the-night, non-stop birdsong. An alumnus from the Abington Senior High School Class of 1989, Tolbert has also previously served as Abington's assistant football coach, focusing on quarterbacks and special teams, as well as, the junior varsity team, from 1999-2009, and again in 2013. During his most recent season, the team advanced to the District 1 Class AAAA Semifinals. In addition, Tolbert brings vast experience from the competitive landscape of Florida high school football, where he worked as a quarterbacks coach, running backs coach, and offensive coordinator at Wekiva High School and West Orange High School. Additionally, Tolbert worked with Quarterback Nation, All American Games, NFL High School Player Development. 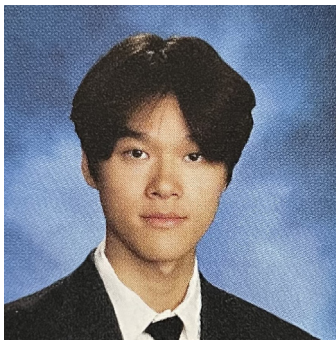
