The President's Message



Dear Fellow Ghosts,
It is my pleasure to welcome you to this edition of the Ghost Stories Newsletter. Whether you graduated recently or many years ago, the spirit of Abington continues to connect us all, and we are proud to celebrate the accomplishments, memories, and traditions that make our Ghost community so special.

We are honored to share that the Alumni Association has been notified of a generous gift from the estate of Karen Eastwood Tompkins, Class of 1966. Gifts like these help support the alumni scholarships awarded each year. Alumni who are considering ways to support Alumni in the future may wish to explore including the Alumni Association in their estate planning.

I want to share the following update on the new Abington Middle School. In a May 2025 referendum, voters in Abington Township and the Borough of Rockledge approved a \$285 million investment to build a new Abington Middle School, following several years of community input, research and planning. The new middle school will be approximately 345,000 square feet and will create a modern learning environment that meets today's needs and prepares students for the future. The estimated square footage for the new building was based on several factors, including the District's educational program, academic needs, common spaces, performing arts, fitness and wellness spaces, and space for building administration, student services and other operations. It will be constructed behind the Administration

Building, where the tennis courts and practice track are located. The project is currently in the design phase and remains on schedule and on budget. In the year since the referendum was passed, the District has continued its commitment to ensuring the Abington Middle School project is developed through a community-driven process, seeking ongoing feedback from key stakeholders via community-wide online surveys and meetings with neighbors, teachers and staff. A community open house will also be held on April 21st to review designs and next steps with the public. Construction of the new building is estimated to start in 2027. Students will continue learning in the existing Middle School until the new one is complete, with the new building anticipated to open for students and staff in the fall of 2029. Once the new Middle School is built, other construction projects on the Middle School campus will take place, such as restoring athletic facilities, constructing new parking, and demolishing the existing Middle School. The entire project will likely continue into the summer of 2030. More information will continue to be made available throughout the design and construction phases at:

Where Are They Now?

Jennifer Wargo – Class of 1987

Dr. Jennifer A. Wargo is a nationally recognized physician-scientist based in Texas, known for her pioneering work in cancer immunotherapy and the role of the microbiome in cancer treatment. She serves as a Professor and leader at The University of Texas MD Anderson Cancer Center in Houston, where she has held multiple leadership roles, including Chair of the Department of Genomic Medicine.

Dr. Wargo earned her undergraduate degree from Duke University and her medical degree from Harvard Medical School. She completed her surgical training at Massachusetts General Hospital and went on to specialize in surgical oncology, with a focus on melanoma and other solid tumors.

Her research has significantly advanced understanding of how the immune system interacts with cancer, particularly in the context of immune checkpoint inhibitors. Dr. Wargo is widely known for her groundbreaking studies demonstrating that the gut microbiome can influence a patient's response to immunotherapy. This work has helped open new avenues for personalized cancer treatment strategies and therapeutic development.

In addition to her research, Dr. Wargo is an accomplished clinician who treats patients with complex cancers, integrating cutting-edge science into clinical care. She has authored numerous high-impact scientific publications and has been recognized with many prestigious awards for her contributions to oncology and translational research.

Dr. Wargo is also deeply committed to mentoring the next generation of scientists and physicians, and she plays an active role in national and international cancer research initiatives. Through her leadership and innovation, she continues to shape the future of cancer treatment both in Texas and around the world.

Jordy Trachtenberg – Class of '87 is currently living in Ho Chi Minh City, Vietnam. For close to a decade, he has lived in Thailand and Cambodia, and for the last seven years has been based in Vietnam. These days, he splits his time between marketing and branding projects and exploring the streets of Saigon, often documenting it all through social media, photography, and writing. Known for diving headfirst into the unexpected, Jordy has built a following as a street food aficionado, connecting with locals, wandering in and out of temples, and capturing the rhythm of daily life abroad. He lives his life through baptism by cultural immersion and leans fully into the experience wherever he goes. He has recently completed his first manuscript about his hellacious year living in Cambodia. From street food alleys to on-camera moments, he continues to chase stories that feel alive and unpredictable. He still wears sunglasses indoors.

Dr. Janet Smith Warfield – Class of 1954 is founder and director of The Planetary Peace, Power, and Prosperity Legacy Foundation. She previously worked as an attorney and author and has presented workshops internationally. She has described the foundation's ambitions in expansive terms, referring to its work as "a semantic solution to all the human-created suffering on our planet." In that framing, conflict is not only a matter of external circumstance, but of interpretation—how people assign meaning, attach intent to words, and treat perspective as fact.

The organization functions as a collective of individuals—board members, hosts, and collaborators—whose work connects to the mission in different ways. Some contribute through media and public dialogue. Others describe service work rooted in education, mentoring, and community support. The structure is a network organized around shared principles and a shared vocabulary.

The foundation does not define itself primarily through material aid. Rather, its center of gravity is reflective and relational, emphasizing language, perception, and communication as skills capable of shifting society. At the same time, contributors describe those principles as something meant to travel beyond conversation—into the daily decisions and community efforts that shape how people live with one another.

Dr. Warfield sometimes uses spiritual and cross-cultural reference points to illustrate this tension, including the idea that humans moved away from direct experience into abstraction through naming, categorizing, and judging. In her telling, words help people communicate, but they also fragment what was once whole, inviting analysis and judgment where fluid awareness once lived.

On its website, the organization articulates both a broad vision and a directional framework for change. It states: "Our vision: To consciously and intentionally use our co-creative power to develop ideas, present solutions, and promote action for the greater good of humanity and the planet. Our mission: To attract each human consciousness, through deep listening, clear speaking, and conscious conversation."

Tribute to Wayne Ambler Cunningham Past President

Wayne lived a life defined by purpose, passion, and an unwavering commitment to others. He grew into a man whose influence stretched far beyond the fields, classrooms, and communities he served graduating in the Class of 1950.

After earning his degree in Economics, from Duke University, he answered the call of duty and served honorably in the U.S. Army's Counter Intelligence Corps. Yet it was in education and athletics that he found his true calling. Returning to Temple University for his Master's and Doctorate in Health Education, Wayne dedicated his career to teaching, mentoring, and coaching.

Sports were woven into the fabric of Wayne's life. He was a gifted athlete whose achievements included winning the 1969 World Softball Championship with the legendary "Sal's Lunch" team. He played soccer with the Germantown and Moorestown Cricket Clubs and spent countless evenings on the softball fields of Max Myers Playground. Even after retiring from college coaching, Wayne continued to pour his energy into the next generation, coaching girls' softball at William Tennent High School and New Hope Solebury High School. For more than 40 years, he also served as a respected soccer and wrestling referee—always fair, always dedicated, always present.

Wayne's contributions did not go unnoticed. He was inducted into the Abington High School Hall of Fame in 2013 in the category of athletics and also the Philadelphia Softball Hall of Fame and the Pennsylvania Sports Hall of Fame.

Within the association, Wayne's leadership was equally valued. He served as president in the early 1970s and later continued his involvement as a member at large and a devoted contributor to the news staff.

Wayne Ambler Cunningham leaves behind a legacy of integrity, dedication, and love for the games and communities that shaped him. His spirit lives on in every athlete he coached, every student he taught, and every life he quietly strengthened along the way. His passing was August 2, 2025 at 93.

Sports

The 2025–2026 athletic year at Abington Senior High School marked one of the most successful and well-rounded periods in recent school sports history, highlighted by championship performances, national recognition, and strong participation across nearly every program. The Abington “Galloping Ghosts,” competing in the Suburban One League, fielded teams in a wide range of varsity sports including football, boys and girls soccer, basketball, baseball, softball, lacrosse, field hockey, golf, tennis, swimming, cross country, track and field, wrestling, volleyball, ice hockey. **Abington Senior High School athletics reached a historic milestone when the boys varsity soccer team captured a PIAA state championship with a 3–1 victory in the state finals, giving the school one of its most celebrated athletic achievements in decades and energizing the entire student community. The team’s success continued beyond the title, earning a national ranking that placed Abington among the top high school soccer programs in the country, demonstrating the growing strength of the school’s soccer tradition.**

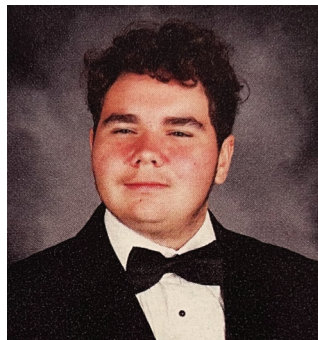
Beyond soccer, the 2025–2026 season showcased competitive balance across multiple sports programs. Boys basketball recorded key victories during the winter season. Track and field and cross-country athletes continued building on established program success through indoor and outdoor competition seasons, while fall and spring teams such as football, lacrosse, baseball, softball, field hockey, tennis, volleyball, golf, swimming, wrestling, and ice hockey maintained active schedules representing Abington in regional competition. Together, these achievements reflected a school culture defined by participation, teamwork, and consistent athletic growth. The 2025–2026 year ultimately stood as a defining chapter in Abington Senior High School sports history—one that combined championship glory, competitive depth across all sports, and a strong sense of school pride shared by athletes, coaches, and the wider Abington community.

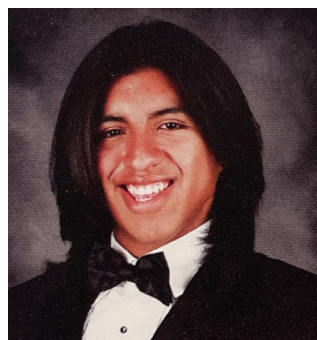
